Ages 3 through 2nd Grades

John 14: 1-14

God's House



Materials needed:

Bible or Spark Story Bible

Items to Create an Altar for your house: small battery -operated candle, small cross, bible or bible story book, heart of any kind, small cloth to put down first in the area where you wish to make your altar, your own ideas

Blanket and pillows to make a tent

1. Today we are going to learn how knowing who Jesus is also means that we know about God. We learn about God through Jesus.
2. Read the Story "God's House" to your child or with your child found in John 14: 1-14 and on page 448 of the Spark Story Bible. You can

also hear Mrs. Schoch tell the story on our Light of Christ Lutheran Church Youth Facebook page.

3. Jesus said, "I am the way to know God. Because you know me, you know God, too." Jesus tells his followers to ask Him for any help they may need in knowing what God wants them to do. He tells them to ask for help in prayer. "Ask for anything and I will help you," Jesus said.

4. Activities to support the story:

a. Ask your parents to help you find a place where you can make a small family altar. Since we cannot worship God in our churches and Sunday School right now, it is great to have a quiet place where you can go to think about God. You can pray to Him and thank Him for something each day and ask for His help with something that is hard to do right now. Seeing an altar in your home will help you remember that Jesus is always with you. Ideas for a family altar are a small cloth to place first on the area where your altar will be located. Add a small cross, a heart of any kind, a battery-operated candle, a bible or a bible story book, something that you have from Sunday School and your own ideas. Plan a time for your family to read a bible story, pray together as a family and sing some songs near your altar. Ask Jesus for anything that you want help with and He will help you.

b. A fun idea for children as you know is to allow them to make a tent with a large blanket, a table and some pillows. Having a quiet place to pray, read, dream and/or imagine is very important right now with all of us together at home for

extended time periods. Each can have their own time in the tent and/or siblings can play together. Have Fun!!
